FROM THE DESK OF THE CEO

As we charge ahead in the first quarter, let's take a lookback at how our region ended 2023.

GLI's project pipeline experienced a notable 93% growth in 2023. This can be attributed to a rising interest in economic activity across our region, along with the growth of our economic development team.

At the end of December 2023, 58 projects were considering relocating to or expanding within our region, potentially creating over 5,700 new jobs across various industries. This estimate of 5,700 new jobs is conservative, as many companies reveal the exact job numbers late in the process.


GLI's Regional Economic Update in December highlighted how the Louisville Muhammad Ali International Airport (SDF) is excelling as a logistics hub, hosting UPS Worldport and UPS Airlines, and ranking as the world's fifth busiest cargo airport, with over 380 daily flights. 2023 also marked the airport's busiest year for passenger travel, with over 4.6 million total passengers served. GLI's next Regional Economic Development Update, scheduled for Thursday, March 28, will focus on the economic opportunities associated with LOUMED's placemaking strategy and infrastructure investments. 
We are grateful for your ongoing support and investment in GLI, and we eagerly anticipate more exciting achievements in 2024.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PIPELINE



GLI's project pipeline grew by 93% in 2023. At the end of December 2023, 58 projects were considering relocating to or expanding within our region, potentially creating over 5,700 new jobs across various industries. As most companies do not share the approximate number of new jobs for a project until late in the process, the estimate of 5,700 new jobs is conservative and we believe the number could be tens of thousands. Among the active projects, 36 represent attraction projects, and 22 represent expansion projects. Collectively, these projects represent close to \$2.6 billion in potential new investments.

LOUISVILLE MUHAMMAD ALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Dan Mann, executive director, and Megan Atkins Thoben, vice president of operations and customer engagement, of the Louisville Regional Airport Authority spoke at Greater Louisville Inc.'s Regional Economic Update in December. The Louisville Muhammad Ali International Airport (SDF) is soaring to new heights and proving itself as a logistics leader. In addition to being home to UPS Worldport and base for UPS Airlines, SDF is the fifth busiest cargo airport in the world with over 380 daily flights. 2023 also marked the airport's busiest year for passenger travel, with over 4.6 million total passengers served.



Helping power the regional economy, SDF's economic impact totaled \$10.4 billion and contributed \$451.1 million to state and local taxes at the end of last year. In 2023, one out of every seven dollars in Louisville Metro tax revenue came from airport operations. Additionally, SDF accounted for 82,723 jobs - or one in every eight jobs in Louisville Metro. 
GREATER LOUISVILLE PARTNERSHIP INTRODUCES PARTNER-SPECIFIC PAGES ON WEBSITE


NATIONAL ECONOMIC INDICATORS

In December, the national economy saw an addition of 216,000 jobs. Throughout 2023, the average job gain per month stood at 225,000 jobs, surpassing the anticipated 170,000 jobs per month. Currently, there are approximately 3 million more workers than before the pandemic. However, if the participation rate matched that of February 2020, there would be an additional 2.2 million workers in the labor force.


Between October and November, the number of job openings declined, yet there are 2.5 million more job openings than unemployed individuals. Although the labor market continues to be competitive, there was a decrease in worker demand between Q3 and Q4. Additionally, the number of resignations slightly decreased. Companies are still hiring new employees, and workers are still optimistic about leaving their current jobs to find better opportunities.





LOUISVILLE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) reported that the unemployment rate for the Louisville MSA was 3.3% in December, a decrease compared to the Q3 unemployment rate of 3.7%. The national unemployment rate of 3.7% remained unchanged between Q3 and Q4.




The Greater Louisville region has sustained healthy employment growth since the pandemic, as shown in the table below. Although employment in the information and financial activities sectors saw declines last year, the construction, mining, and logging industries saw strong employment gains in Q4, achieving a noteworthy 10.0% employment growth over the preceding 12 months.



LOUISVILLE EMPLOYMENT RATE

Louisville saw a slight decrease in total employment at the end of Q4 2023 compared to Q3. Despite the modest decline between Q3 and Q4, employment levels across the Louisville MSA remained near a 10 year high. The health of Louisville's employment rate can be seen in national trends, as well. The national economy added 353,000 new jobs in January, far exceeding analyst predictions that the economy would add 185,000 jobs.
